#### Viewing Catalog and Schedule Information

Class Schedule and Course Catalog information is best viewed using Self Service Banner (SSB). You do not need a login to access the information. You can get to SSB without logging in by going to the college's homepage and clicking on Academics, and then choose either College Catalog or Class Schedules from Related Links on the right navigation page.

Use search criteria to refine the list of courses you want to look at. You can choose 1 subject, use Ctrl key to choose multiple subjects. (You can also search on all of the subjects but the results will take longer to return.) You can also further refine your search by selecting an attribute, or Area.
