The Holleran Center for Community Action and Public Policy is an interdisciplinary academic center at Connecticut College. Our mission is to cultivate responsible civic engagement and leadership for social justice through engaged scholarship and reciprocal community collaborations.

Created in 1996 and supported by generous gifts from civic and philanthropic leaders Jerry and Carolyn Holleran '60, the Center builds community partnerships; supports student-faculty-staff educational and research initiatives; and encourages the critical analysis of local, state and national public policies. The Center administers three programmatic areas at Connecticut College: Community Partnerships & Engagement; Engaged Scholarship and Community Learning; and the Certificate Program in Community Action and Public Policy (PICA).

Holleran Center scholars earn a Certificate in Community Action and Public Policy at graduation by successfully supplementing their majors with a series of seminars, including the Holleran Center Gateway Course: Public Policy and Social Ethics; four additional courses that expand their understanding of an enduring community challenge; conducting a College-sponsored summer internship; and completing a senior integrative project.
